# Friends of Pathways 21st Annual Fundraiser, "Wild West in the Park" raises \$650,000 for Pathways to Independence. Lock, Stock and Barrel!

We had a Rootin' Tootin' good time! "Our Wild West in the Park fundraiser was an incredible success," said Lisa Mais, Fund Developer for Pathways. "We are so grateful to all the guests, donors, restaurants, and sponsors who contributed their money, time, talents and services towards our cause, and especially to all our Friends of Pathways volunteers for being the 'ace in the hole' to guarantee that this year's event would be our best fundraiser yet!" Expenses for this year's event were less than 10% of the total raised, among the lowest of our recent events. The \$650,000 raised during our fundraiser is instrumental in reaching our yearly budget goal of \$1.4 million, which helps us change the lives of 50 young women. Thank you for getting us closer to our goal!

Park Estates was transformed into the Old West for over 500 guests who dined on delicious food from 30 restaurants in Long Beach and the surrounding area. The women receive the emotional and fiscal support they need to reach their goal of graduating college, finding a job and becoming contributing members of society. Since its inception in 1991, Pathways has helped more than 350 women, of whom 80 percent have graduated from college.

Pathways' volunteer roster includes more than 50 medical professionals, 40-plus licensed therapists, 17-plus dentists and orthodontists and a growing list of attorneys, printers, mechanics, accountants, and other professions. 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# Charitable Giving & Taxes \*\*Fnow the Rules\*\*

As the new year approaches we hope that you will consider Pathways to Independence in your giving plans and contribute to transforming the lives the young women we serve.

The greatest benefit of charitable giving is the knowledge that you've helped make a difference in the lives of others. Yet giving can also provide tax breaks so long as you are aware of the rules and keep track of what you have donated. You should always consult with a legal and tax professional on charitable giving matters.

There are several methods of donating to the charities that you support. There are the obvious direct gifts of cash or non-cash gifts of property (including such items as clothing, jewelry, furniture, computers, automobiles and boats) and some not so obvious ways that you can contribute:

**Donate appreciated securities** – Donors who are considering current year charitable contributions and are also facing long-term capital gains taxes on appreciated stock that they have held for more than a year can realize a much more favorable income tax result and charitable impact by making a timely donation of the appreciated stock directly to Pathways to Independence. If a donor sells the stock first and then donates the cash proceeds to Pathways, the donor may be subject to capital gains taxes on the proceeds from the sale of the stock. But if a donor contributes appreciated stock held for more than one year directly to Pathways, the donor can usually deduct the fair market value of the donation without realizing any capital gain.

**Donor-Advised Fund** – A fund maintained in your name by a public charity from which you may recommend grants over time for charitable purposes.

**Charitable Remainder Trust (CRT)** – An arrangement in which cash or property is transferred to a trust. You and/or other beneficiaries receive income from the trust for a period of time, after which the remaining principal becomes the property of the charity.

**Charitable Lead Trust (CLT)** – A CRT in reverse. Charities become the income beneficiaries, receiving a stream of income from the trust for a period of time, after which the named noncharitable beneficiaries receive the remaining trust principal.

Charitable donations are an excellent way to make a difference in the lives of others while also reducing you<mark>r ta</mark>xes.

## Where are they now?

We truly appreciate the wonderful group of clients with whom we have been privileged to have worked together with these past 26 years. They have worked hard, confronted their pasts, transformed

graduates and where she is now...

I was born to a single mother with few resources or support. My father, a heroin addict, continued to struggle with his addiction and we didn't meet until I was 21 years old. My mother and I lived with several relatives until she married

my step father when I was three years old and we finally had a stable home.

We lived in a traditional home, my mother a homemaker and my stepfather working two jobs to support our growing family. Although my stepfather provided for my basic necessities, he also sexually abused me for many years. Like many children, I did not disclose the abuse due to fear, guilt and shame. As a result I developed low self-esteem, anxiety, depression; I engaged in unhealthy relationships.

My outward behavior was excellent: a straight-A student, social butterfly, and obedient child. In my mind, perfect children are not victims of abuse. I was accepted into Cal State University of Long Beach and began attending school while continuing to reside at home. However, my unaddressed trauma and daily interaction with my perpetrator began to manifest itself in suicidal thoughts, anger and resentment towards my mother.

At the time I was working part time and had decided to drop out of school in order to work full-time, so I could move out of the house. Then I heard about Pathways to Independence through my employers who encouraged me to apply. I applied and after my interview I was informed of the waiting list. Only a week later I received a call that a spot had become available, and I was accepted into Pathways. I thought it was too good to be true!

I was assisted with housing expenses in order to move out of my parents' home as well as financial assistance to continue my education. I began participating in therapy to address my abuse, disclosed the abuse to my mother and worked on our strained relationship. Pathways also paid for my participation in various retreats including an Incest Survivor Retreat which helped guide my decision in my career choice. In 2007 I graduated from CSULB with a Bachelors of Social Work and currently work as a Children's Social Worker for Department of Children and Family Services. I investigate child abuse and neglect allegations, working with

children who share similar stories to mine and serve to protect them from any further abuse or neglect.

However, I attribute the most important factors of my success in Pathways to be my mentor, Suzy Gowin and Dave Bishop, who have truly been like a mother and father to me. When I felt like giving up, they were always there to listen, encourage and guide me every step of the way. They are the most selfless, humble, loving individuals who taught me to believe in myself and break the cycle of abuse.

With the help of my mentor I have managed to get through some of the toughest academic and personal struggles. I never really thought I "needed" therapy, because I always dealt with issues on my own. But thanks to Pathways, I am able to see my amazing therapist, Kate, once a week and just vent.

I am also very thankful for the car that Pathways has provided for me because it makes traveling to school or work so much easier. The Pathways volunteers have taught me how to care for my car as well. I didn't know the first thing about an oil change or even how car insurance works.

I have also discovered my love for Astronomy and Physics, and everyone has been very supportive about my decision to pursue such a unique career for a young woman. EVERY MORNING

I have been provided with all the resources to succeed, even a math tutor, since my major involves a lot of math.

Interest in my health is another benefit. I have recently enrolled into Cross Fit because of Pathways. I have also been changing my

eating habits, so that I can get into shape and become healthier. I have had the chance to see an optometrist for the first time in my life, as well regular appointments with a dentist, a doctor, and an orthodontist for a problem with my jaw that I have had for years.

As a Pathways Client I was able to attend Equine Therapy, a very therapeutic and unique experience for me.

Thanks to all of the supporters and volunteers, I have a true chance to do something great with my life, to tackle life's obstacles and become stronger. This is something that Pathways has shown me, and for that I am very grateful.
