Record Number of Pathways Clients Earn College Degrees in 2019

More than half planning to attend graduate school.

For the Pathways to Independence clients who came together in late June to celebrate their graduation from college, the occasion was an opportunity to take stock of their personal achievements, but the event also marked a significant milestone for the organization itself - the 2019 graduating class of 13 young women represents the largest since Pathways' founding in 1991. Impressively, more than half of this year's Pathways graduates plan to further their education and pursue advanced degrees.

Pathway's Executive Director Goretty Ramos, who emceed this year's ceremony, beamed as she reflected on each graduate's accomplishments.

"Despite their difficult pasts, these young women dared to dream," Ramos told the audience. "It's been a humbling experience to witness their individual transformations. Now they're facing a new journey, going into the world to make a positive impact."

Then, one by one, Ramos introduced the graduates and they shared their stories. They talked about how they initially came to Pathways and the myriad of challenges they've had to overcome to obtain a

degree. The women's circumstances vary, but for many the struggles included bouts of homelessness, addiction, incarceration, as well as physical and sexual abuse. By the time they were accepted into Pathways, most of the women had little hope and even less self-esteem.

"I have pride in who I am today because Pathways helped me foster a sense of worthiness," said Roxanne D. "Before I felt like an invisible void with an aimless existence. Pathways has given me a second chance at actually having a life that is worth living."

Those sentiments were echoed by virtually all this year's graduates and they voiced their gratitude for Pathways' unflagging support, both emotional and material. Several graduates noted the mattress Pathways furnished them when they first entered the program was the first bed they'd ever had of their own. Another, who dropped out of high school and lost custody of her children due to addiction, said the dental work Pathways provided to restore her drug-ravaged smile helped give her the confidence not only to tackle college, but also to seek a reunion with her kids. But whether their immediate futures include graduate school, pursuing a career, or starting a family, collectively the women expressed a desire to give back and help others like themselves who've faced adversity.

Asked about the reasons behind 2019's record-large graduating class, Executive Director Ramos modestly demurred, saying much of it is due to timing and coincidence. But she acknowledged it's also a testament to the impressive results Pathway's continues to achieve as it approaches its third decade.

"We're going to miss the dynamic women who were part of this year's graduating class," Ramos said. "Their journeys with Pathways helped make their lives better and they helped us make history. They'll be much missed."

But Ramos pointed out there's a silver lining. The departure of this year's graduates will open up a record number of slots for the girls on Pathways' growing waiting list – the future graduating class of 2023.



Mentors are encouraged to have a face-to-face meeting (coffee, brunch, etc.) at least once per quarter, more if desired, just to further ensure that all is well.

Training for mentors will include the best tools and resources to support the young women through their transformative journey.


