# New Study Lounge Keeps Clients Motivated

Pathways to Independence cares about the mental health and emotional wellbeing of our clients. As the pandemic continues to impact our clients, they have experienced increased isolation and lack of connection. Online classes can be challenging and after many hours stuck inside and alone, the young women of Pathways are missing a sense of community.

To answer this call, clients, volunteers, and donors have come together to create a safe study space. Utilizing a vacant 2-bedroom apartment and an adjacent backyard

on the property, Pathways has set out to create a study lounge and outside study area. Clients have been instrumental in this project, not only was a pandemic-compliant study space their idea, but they also come together to set up the study lounge themselves.

The study lounge includes a strong Wi-Fi signal, socially distanced study areas, cleaning supplies and masks for Covid safety, and coffee and snacks, so that our cash-pressed clients do not have to study on an empty stomach. The indoor study lounge is now complete and will be open for as long as the pandemic requires online courses and social distancing; the outside study space will be a permanent addition to our building and it is in the works.

As a current Pathways to Independence client, I cannot imagine how difficult it would be for me to cope with this pandemic, and with the division ripping through an increasingly polarized nation, if I did not have the supportive people and services that Pathways provides.

Many Pathways clients, including myself, are finding school to be exponentially harder during this remote, online learning COVID era. Spending so much time isolated in my apartment to attend Zoom classes can be lonely and difficult to deal with. My incredible therapist increased my EMDR sessions and routinely texts me to check in. Reliable and convenient transportation is vital to the safety and well-being of our program participants. Our two volunteer Auto Coordinators oversee the procurement and maintenance of the vehicles our young women need to be successful along their path to independence.

Jim McGee and Glen Simpson come well-equipped to handle the myriad of auto issues that arise as our clients travel to class, work, therapy, and other endeavors. (Even in this season of Covid, their cars are essential). Jim, a former mechanic, has been generously donating his time for over 3 years. Glen, who worked as a service technician for 20+ years and service manager for 10 years, has been with us for the past 2 years.

convenient includes such responsibilities as arranging repair of the clients' cars with repair shops, as well as acting volunteer as advocate when issues arise. Glen Simpson obtains used cars for new tenance of clients without their own car, as well as replacements for those cars which have outlived the cost of repair.
