Pathways is proud to feature Cristina Stricklin, 2016 graduate and current Board Member.

Cristina learned of Pathways through some friends who graduated our program the same year she entered. Though she knew the direction she wanted her life to take, she needed support to bring her goals within reach.

After failing out of many courses at Long Beach City College, due to personal and financial issues, she began studies at Cypress JC as a Pathways client. She was able to transfer with an Associates degree and complete her B.A. in Psychology at Cal State Dominguez Hills in 2019.

She credits Pathways with providing her the emotional baseline to weather life's ups and downs and manage to maintain balance.

Cristina loved having a safe study and living space in her Pathways Apartment, where she was able to connect with other Pathways clients. She learned skills for managing routine household responsibilities, as well as collaborative study.

"Amazingly, my last year in Pathways, I was attending college full-time, had two part-time jobs to help to support myself, took on a volunteer position one night a week to gain experience and knowledge in my field, and was able to maintain my grades and relationships!"

Cristina is currently employed at Starview Community Services as a Case Manager and Support Counselor for adolescents and transitional youth, where she's gaining professional experience as she prepares to pursue a graduatelevel degree with a view to becoming a Marriage and Family Therapist. Coupled with her position on the Board of Directors for Pathways, you might think Cristina has a lot on her plate. But since she needed additional responsibilities, she also volunteered to serve as Chair for our Marketing Committee.

We wish Cristina continued success in her future endeavors and thank her for "paying it forward" through her service at Pathways to Independence.
