CHAMPIONS OF ABILITY IS A NON-PROFIT WITH VOLUNTEERS FROM VARIOUS BACKGROUNDS. THE VOLUNTEERS ARE MOSTLY COMPRISED OF CLIENTS AND STAFF FROM VOCATIONAL INNOVATIONS WHO WANT TO MAKE A DIFFERENCE IN THE LIVES OF OTHERS.

Our Champions created an awareness walk to raise money to help provide emergency care kits for the women of Pathways to Independence. The idea behind the awareness walk was that any person from any background can do what they set their mind to. The Champions raised \$3,000.00 to help provide these women with a basic need: safety, to which every human should be entitled. Christina Ruiz, a Champion, took charge of this project with the help of her peers and staff and created these beautiful fire safety kit bags. Not only did this make the Champions feel amazing for helping those in need but they had fun doing it.



I cannot believe that we are more than halfway through 2022, and only a few months away from our "Pathways to the Future" event in the Park Estates neighborhood of Long Beach.

Back in April, the Pathways to Independence Board of Directors and staff attended a full-day retreat. The time spent together allowed us to have deep dialogue and reflect on our mission and how we want to execute on that mission. Shortly after, we realized that we needed to fill our open vacancy on the board, which was created when Diana Hill transitioned from the board to our Interim Executive Director. In June, we held interviews and we are so pleased to have brought on two dynamite additions to our Board, Robert Casares and Ana Lopez.

It has been an amazing first six months of 2022 for Pathways to Independence. As we have come out of a difficult time of change and challenges, we are finding incredible strength in our clients and the future. Here are some highlights:

NEW PATHWAYS CLIENTS:

On June 1st, we accepted five new clients into Pathways. We implemented a new "provisional client" category. These are clients who may be lacking units or length of sobriety but are committed to their future. We accept them with additional conditions, and they are housed in a one of the Pathways apartment buildings in a guest unit, while they work towards permanent placement status.

PATHWAYS GRADUATION CELEBRATION:

On June 29th, we had our first in-person graduation in 2 ¹/₂ years. It was amazing to come together as a community to celebrate our seven grads. We also were able to award nine clients with GPA awards (for a GPA of 3.5 or higher), two clients were also recognized for making the Honor Roll at their schools, and mentors gave 13-character awards to clients showing extraordinary character. We also recognized a well-deserving volunteer.



SEVEN NEW GRADUATES:

As mentioned above, we celebrated seven graduates as they launch into the next stage of their lives. It was a magical evening. Read more about them in this newsletter.



PARTNERSHIPS:

We are working diligently at building relationships and partnerships with CSULB, Long Beach City College, and Golden West College. These partnerships are to bring awareness to the Pathways program for students who fit our profile. We have also been asked to serve on the EOPS Advisory Boards of LBCC and Golden West. Champions of Ability is also a wonderful partnership. They did a fundraiser to help with fire safety kits for our clients (read more about this awesome group in this newsletter).

LOUNGE DEDICATION:

We converted a two-bedroom unit at our Huntington Beach location into a study lounge and community meeting place for our clients. There is a common room with a big screen TV and bean bag chairs for watching movies and creating community, a "Well Space" for quiet reflection or therapy sessions, and a dedicated study room with desks, a printer, and office supplies. CLIENT SPOTLIGHT

Pathways Alumni is a Summa Cum Laude graduate of CSUF

Before entering Pathways, I spent a year living in an indigent women's home recovering from a heroin addiction. My addiction started in high school at the age of 16 and I was consequently expelled for substance use on campus during my sophomore year. Because of this, I began attending continuation school.

My addiction led me to homelessness, jails, and toxic relationships. I spent what should have been my formative years developing into a functional adult, merely surviving, and feeding an addiction that left me hopeless and close to death.

Once I was finally "tired of being sick and tired" and given the tools to recover, there was no looking back for me. I found recovery at 21 years old and when I reached one year of sobriety. I started working in substance use treatment centers and knew I wanted to get an education to learn how to help others through therapy. At the time, I was working full time, living in a sober living home, sharing a bedroom with 3 other women, and riding a bicycle to and from work. In reality, I was not in a position to attend college full time as I desired.

When I first found out about Pathways to Independence, through a friend who was in the program, it sounded like an answer to my prayers; and in fact, it turned out to be just that. The things I desired to achieve in life were made possible through this program. Upon entering Pathways, I was given an apartment, a vehicle, a laptop, and financial support through a rent stipend, so that I could start attending school full time.

I was provided with a mentor, therapist, doctor, dentist, and a mechanic, so that any potential barrier to success was removed. After years of neglecting my physical health, Pathways helped me to become healthy again. For instance, after seeing a dentist for the first time in years, I was able to have 13 cavities filled.

Pathways exceeded my expectations of only receiving a higher education, it also helped me to achieve overall wellness, and transformed into the balanced person I am today.

I was in Pathways for 4 years and earned a bachelor's degree in Human Services from California State University, Fullerton. Not only did I graduate, but I maintained a perfect 4.0 GPA, graduating in the top 1% of my class, an accomplishment made possible by all the support given to me in the Pathways program.

Following my graduation from Pathways, I completed two more years of education earning a master's degree in Social Work. I am now an Associate Clinical Social Worker earning hours towards licensure, with 9 years clean. I am currently working as a Counselor in a medication assisted treatment center where I counsel adults battling the same substance use disorders that once plagued my life. Pathways has helped to enable my success by giving me the opportunity to meet my educational and career goals and gifted me the confidence to strive for more.

I am forever grateful for the support I received from Pathways. Every success I have had this far, I can relate back to the solid foundation Pathways provided me. I am filled with gratitude for all of the donors and volunteers who make up Pathways as I continue the journey to reaching my full potential.
