Perhaps the most cherished of our annual events at Pathways to Independence is June graduation.



On Sunday June 22nd, Pathways staff, volunteers, clients and alumni joined in Rossmoor, CA to celebrate our 2025 graduates. This year, we honored four phenomenal young women at the event: **Andrea Clarey, Cherokee Evans, Jessica King** and **Jessica Serrano**, all of whom graduated with a bachelor's degree. We also celebrated the December graduation of **Jackie Manuel-Perez** who was unable to attend due to career conflict.

The graduation ceremony began as many of our special events do - with a moment of gratitude, led by Executive Director Diana Hill. Shortly after, clients and guests enjoyed the opportunity to connect with one another at our reception dinner.

After, Diana Hill kicked off the awards ceremony with a special reflection and by sharing the music and lyrics of the 1970's classic, 'I am Woman' by Helen Reddy. With its triumphant statement, "I am strong, I am invincible, I am woman", the tone for the evening was powerfully set.

Meet Joanna, Pathways Alum, making an impact on the world around her, and driven by her passion service to others in the non-profit sector.

Our Pathways grads are unrivaled in their commitment to "pay it forward " by making their world a better place, and no one embodies this spirit of giving better than Joanna, who received her degree back in 2009.

Since her graduation from Pathways to Independence, she has held roles in program management, event planning, and fundraising with organizations such as the Children's Defense Fund—Beat the Odds Program (in California and New York), Mount Sinai Health System in New York, and the Pratt Institute in Brooklyn.

After 12 years in nonprofit endeavors, she has served as an event planner in the private sector for the past three years. In retrospect, Joanna notes, "While I gained valuable insights and skills during this time, I'm planning to return to the nonprofit space this fall, where my passion truly lies."

Joanna learned of Pathways from her older sister, who encouraged her to apply. A product of a very unstable home life, she found that Pathways to Independence was the perfect fit for her: "Pathways helped clear the roadblocks that were holding me back and gave me the support to move forward, both in my education and personal growth."

She cites access to therapy as one of the most important parts of her experience in Pathways—"Therapy gave me the tools to process my past, build confidence, and truly start to heal."

Following graduation, Joanna literally "jumped" right into her commitment to service to the community: "While living in California, I was a mentor for the Jumpstart Program, which had offered me support while I was in high school."

Later she began work for the Children's Defense Fund's Beat the Odds Program, where she had the chance to give back in a deeper way. Joanna was able to use her personal experience and the positive impact of programs like Jumpstart and Pathways to Independence to expand and strengthen the Beat the Odds Initiative.

Joanna's success has not been limited to her professional life. She speaks proudly of her family, which includes an incredible husband who has been her partner for 15 years, as well as their two beautiful daughters, ages 6 and 5, plus two cats, "As a family, we love to travel, go to the beach, watch movies, and cook or bake together. We also enjoy going to the theater, exploring art, and spending time painting—creativity is a big part of our lives."

Though the family has enjoyed their 10 wonderful years living in New York, and their current home in Miami, Joanna and her husband miss California deeply and plan to move back in the next couple years. And her Pathways family here will be thrilled to welcome Joanna and her family back "home" one day in the near future.
