CLIENT UPDATE

Meet our new clients:

SM - age 25, attending Saddleback College, in her Sophomore year, Major Psychology, works as a English tutor and Sunday school teacher. What are you most proud of "I'm proud that I've earned good grades in my classes so far, and that I'm still being active in trying new things and facing the things I need to do. I'm trying to be the type of person who's okay with making mistakes."

SF - age 21, attending CSULB in her Senior year, Major Theater Arts, works as an in home care provider. How would you rate your overall well-being "I am feeling very well, happy and no longer really stressed or down."

JG - age 33, attending Orange Coast College in her Freshman year, Major Psychology, works as a case manager in a recovery center. What are you most proud of "I'm making all A's in my classes."

EM - age 34, attending Golden West College in her Sophomore year, Major ADN/RN Nursing, works as: Behavioral Health Technician. What are you most proud of "I passed my CNA state board exam and so far I have all A's in all my classes except one and that's physio, it's oh so hard to get so much info in such a short time! My brain hurts but I'm trying."

KG - age 23, attending Golden West College in her Freshman year, Major Nursing, Works as a CNA at a health care facility, What are you happy about: "I'm excited to move into the Pathways housing!"

Many of our clients begin their journey at a community college, and this year was no exception. In early summer, four of them attended a transfer workshop hosted by our Education Director, Brenda Gallegos to prepare their university applications. Their hard work paid off. **All four received multiple acceptance letters** and are now choosing where they will continue their

education. Their options include *California State University Long Beach, California State University Fullerton, California State University Los Angeles, and Cal Poly Pomona*. Their majors span public health, psychology, and nursing. We are incredibly proud of every one of them.

NEW TO THE TEAM:

This year we also welcomed a valuable addition to our team. Our new Development Assistant, **Jane Emfinger,** brings a wealth of corporate experience, success with Special Olympics, strong relationships in Orange County, and most importantly, a passion



for our mission. We are thrilled to have her join our team.

With growth comes the need for more coordinators, our dedicated volunteer caseworkers. We are excited to welcome **Suzanne Watts** to the team. Suzanne already gives so much to Pathways as a mentor and a Friend of Pathways. Her



professional experience included teaching in English Departments at the community college level - Saddleback, Cypress, and Long Beach City College. Since 2009, she is also a practicing certified yoga instructor.

PROGRAM UPDATE:

This year we have served more than 45 clients, including five recent graduates. That **represents a 95 percent increase since I stepped into this role just three and a half years ago, while our budget has grown only 16 percent.** This is a testament to smart stewardship, teamwork, Board support and direction, and the determination of the women we serve.

As we look ahead to 2026, our commitment remains clear. We want to serve more women,

create more pathways to self-reliance, and ensure that every client transitions into her next chapter with confidence and a strong network behind her.

This year we launched a new program called Pathways Connects, designed to expand our clients' access to professional networks, mentorship. internships, and employment opportunities that align with their school schedules. Keep an eye out for our 2026 networking and business gathering. We have already seen tremendous success through this initiative, including our first-ever Art Show, where one quarter of our clients displayed their artwork professionally for the first time and forged meaningful new connections.

Many of our clients are actively seeking paid internships and part-time positions that support their educational goals. If your organization has opportunities available, we would love to hear from you. Work experience remains a requirement in our program, and your partnership helps build vital career pathways.

DEVELOPMENT UPDATE:

October brought another moment of celebration as we gathered for our annual fundraiser. Thanks to the incredible dedication of the **Friends of Pathways, led by the exceptional Lisa Mais**, the event was a tremendous success. This single evening provides almost half of our annual operating budget, and we could not be more grateful. Lisa's leadership extends far beyond this event, and we are fortunate to have her commitment and heart driving our mission forward.

As we move through the final stretch of 2025, I want to express my deepest gratitude to everyone who has supported Pathways and the remarkable women who are reshaping their futures. Your belief in them matters. Your generosity transforms lives.

JULIE EVERT


When we think of changemakers, it's often those in the spotlight. But the most impactful are often those working quietly behind the scenes. For Pathways, Julie is one of those people.

I've been connected to Pathways in recent


